PART TWO:

Now that you have your questions, you may begin reading your book. When you are done reading your entire book, on a separate sheet of paper, you will create a collage featuring three (3) Haikus and various images relating to your topic. These may be printed, cut from magazines, or hand-drawn. The Haikus may be typed or handwritten. However, all three should be on a single-sheet of paper. Step-by-step instructions and examples follow.

CREATING A HAIKU COLLAGE

1. Select three (3) of the open/closed questions from the first pages in this packet that you were able to answer using the information in your book.
2. Answer each of your questions in the form of a Haiku...

What is a Haiku?

"*Haiku*" is a traditional form of Japanese poetry. *Haiku* poems consist of 3 lines. The first and last lines of a *Haiku* have 5 syllables and the middle line has 7 syllables. The lines rarely rhyme. (www.kidzone.ws/poetry/haiku.htm)

EXAMPLE:

5 —————> heard your car pull in.
7 —————> an eternity has passed
5 —————> since our last moment.

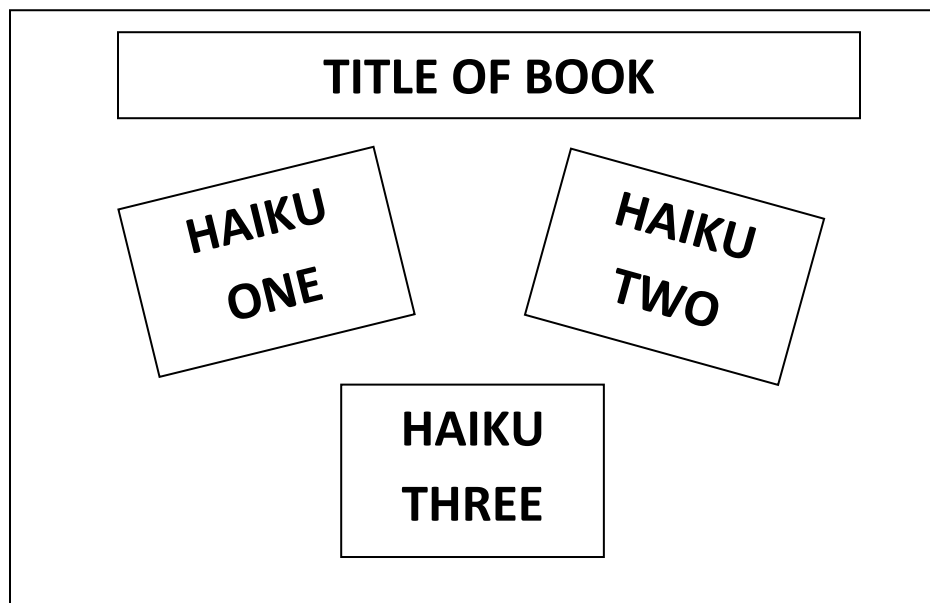
What should my Haikus look like?

Your Haikus need to provide answers to your selected questions.

For example, if you were reading a book on the science of candy and your question was, "How many licks does it take to get to the center of a Tootsie Pop?" and the answer provided in the book was "the world may never know," your Haiku could be...

*TOOTSIE POP PROBLEM:
HOW MANY LICKS TO CENTER?
WORLD MAY NEVER KNOW.*

- 4. After writing your Haikus, you are to create a collage featuring the three poems**



- 5. Surround your Haikus with images that help illustrate your topic and assist in answering your questions!**
